New Delhi, the 20th May, 1999

G.S.R. 216.—In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (b) and (c) of sub-section (2) of section 141 of the Border Security Force Act, 1968 (47 of 1968) and in supersession of the Border Security Force Junior Engineer (Civil) (Group 'C' posts) Recruitment Rules, 1995 except as respects things done or omitted to be done before such supersession, the Central Government hereby makes the following rules regulating the method of recruitment to the posts of Junior Engineer (Civil) (Combatant) in the Border Security Force, namely:—

1. Short title and commencement.—(1) These rules may be called the Border Security Force Junior Engineer (Civil) Combatant (Group 'B' and 'C' posts) Recruitment Rules, 1999.

(2) They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.

2. Number of posts, classification and scale of pay.—The number of the said posts, their classification and the scale of pay attached thereto shall be as specified in columns (2) to (4) of the Schedule annexed to these rules.

3. Method of recruitment, age limit and other qualification.—The method of recruitment to the said posts, age limit, qualifications and other matters relating thereto shall be as specified in columns (5) to (14) of the said Schedule.

4. Disqualification.—No person,—

(a) who has entered into or contracted a marriage with a person having a spouse living; or

(b) who, having a spouse living, has entered into or contracted a marriage with any person,

shall be eligible for appointment to the said posts :

Provided that the Central Government may, if satisfied that such marriage is permissible under the personal law applicable to such person and the other party to the marriage and that there are other grounds for so doing, exempt any person from the operation of this rule.

5. Power to relax.—Whereas the Central Government is of the opinion that it is necessary or expedient so to do, it may, by order, for reasons to be recorded in writing, relax any of the provisions of these rules with respect to any class or category of persons.

6. Saving.—Nothing in these rules shall affect reservations, relaxation of age limit and other concessions required to be provided for the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes, Ex-Servicemen and other special categories of persons in accordance with the orders issued by the Central Government from time to time.

7. Ineligibility.—No person who is not a citizen of India shall, except with the consent of the Central Government, signified in writing, be appointed or employed under these rules :

Provided that nothing contained in these rules shall debar the appointment, enrolment or employment of a subject of a Nepal and Bhutan under these rules.

8. Other conditions of service.—The persons appointed to the Cadre shall be subjected to the Border Security Force Act, 1968 and Border Security Force Rules, 1969 as amended from time to time in respect of other conditions of service not specifically provided for in these rules.

The persons appointed on deputation from other departments shall have to wear the uniform prescribed for the combatant post against which they are appointed and have to undergo six weeks basic training immediately on appointment on deputation.

9. Superannuation.—(1) The personnel appointed under these rules shall retire from service on the afternoon of the last day of the month in which he attains the age of fifty seven years :

Provided that the person whose date of birth is the first of a month shall retire from service on the afternoon of the last day of the preceding month on attaining the age of fifty seven years.

(2) No person shall be granted extension in service beyond the age of retirement of fifty seven years.
