G.S.R. 47.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to article 309 of the Constitution, the President hereby makes the following rules regulating the method of recruitment to Group 'C' and Group 'D' non-combatised posts in the Air Wing of the Directorate General Border Security Force, namely :—

1. Short title and commencement.—(1) These rules may be called the Border Security Force (Air Wing, non-combatised Group 'C' and 'D' posts) Recruitment Rules, 1996.

(2) They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.

2. Number of posts, classification and scale of pay.—The number of the said posts, their classification and the scale of pay attached thereto shall be as specified in columns (2) to (4) of the Schedule annexed to these rules.

3. Method of recruitment, age-limit and other qualifications.—The method of recruitment to the said posts, age-limit, qualification and other matters relating thereto shall be as specified in columns (5) to (14) of the said Schedule.

4. Initial Constitution.—The incumbents of the posts shown in the Schedule who were recruited/appointed before the publication of these rules shall be deemed to have been appointed under these rules on a regular basis and the service rendered by them in the said post before the said publication shall be taken into account for deciding their eligibility for promotion to the next higher grade.

5. Disqualification.—No person—

(a) who has entered into or contracted a marriage with a person having a spouse living, or

(b) who, having a spouse living, has entered into or contracted a marriage with any persons,

shall be eligible for appointment to the said posts :

Provided that the Central Government may, if satisfied that such marriage is permissible under the personal law applicable to such person and the other party to the marriage and that there are other grounds for so doing exempt any person from the operation of this rule.

6. Ineligibility of aliens.—A candidates for enlistment in the Force must conform to the standard laid down in schedule, must bear a good character and must be (a) citizen of India or (b) a person who has migrated from Pakistan with the intention of permanently settling in India or (c) a subject of Nepal or of a Portuguese possession in India and if he comes under category (b) or (c) must be a person in whose favour a certificate of eligibility has been given by the Government of India. A candidate in whose case a certificate is necessary may, however be appointed provisionally subject to the necessary certificate being eventually given to him by Government.

Provided ex-convicts, or Army or Police deserter shall not be enlisted.

7. Power to relax.—Where the Central Government is of the opinion that it is necessary or expedient so to do, it may, by order and for reasons to be recorded in writing relax any of the provisions of these rules with respect to any class or category of persons.

8. Saving.—Nothing in these rules shall affect reservations, relaxation of age-limit and other concessions required to be provided for the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes, Ex-servicemen and other special categories of person in accordance with the orders issued by the Central Government from time to time in this regard.
